Steve Byrne is the Manager of the GSPCA. At the age of 18 he became the youngest manager of the RSPCA and worked in animal welfare across the UK before moving to Guernsey in 2011. Steve now leads the team of 30 staff, over 800 volunteers and the Shelter cares for over 3000 sick, injured and rescued animals a year as well as running other services that benefit the community.

His role is very much a vocation working 24/7 but he is also on the committee of the Association of Dogs and Cats Homes (made up of over 140 animal charities) which helps bring those charities together to strive to do the best they can sharing best practice, knowledge and networking.
